

## West Suburban Teachers Union – Local 571 COPE/PAC: Job Description

**Rationale**: To expand the political influence currently supported by Local 571 and the Illinois Federation of Teachers, the COPE/PAC Chair serves as a liaison to politicians and allows us to make contributions to politicians who share our values and support WSTU. We use the following strategies to raise money for COPE: raffles, voluntary cash contributions, voluntary payroll deductions, and square reader deductions.

## **Job Qualifications**

- 1. Must be a member of West Suburban Teachers Union, Local 571.
- 2. Must be able to work with diverse groups of people and demonstrate a positive attitude.
- 3. Must be able to develop working relationships with legislators.
- 4. Must be able to handle multiple tasks.
- 5. Must be able to work with minimal supervision.
- 6. Must demonstrate good speaking, writing, and computer skills.
- 7. Must be able to work with the Local President, 571 Legislative Director(s), members, and other campaign/ union Legislative Directors.

## **Duties and Responsibilities**

- 1. Complete necessary quarterly reports for the Illinois State Board of Elections regarding campaign contributions and expenditures.
- 2. Complete yearly budget which includes campaign donations and attendance at political events.
- Complete IFT report (required every 4 years) in in order to obtain COPE/PAC funding.
- 4. Consult with WSTU President and other officers about support to politicians
- 5. Research politicians and their voting records.
- 6. Meet with the 571 Legislative Director(s) regularly to discuss ongoing political action.
- 7. Educate members about politicians and their support for public education policies.
- 8. Attend fundraisers for political candidates and encourage members to attend political events.
- 9. Maintain relationships with politicians to encourage strong representation and support of West Suburban Teachers Union and its members.
- 10. Contact politicians via email or phone to discuss political events and donations, and purchase tickets to political events.
- 11. Serve as an IFT Area PAC Chair and on the regional PAC team which endorses political candidates for office
- 12. Manage COPE checking accounts and COPE checkbook
- 13. Attend Executive Board Meetings and House of Representatives Meetings; organize a raffle at each House of Representatives meeting and/or other fund raisers
- 14. Chair 571 COPE/PAC committee.
- 15. Serve on Legislative Breakfast Committee

## **Stipend and Reimbursement**

- 1. Stipend Requirements
  - a. Stipends will be paid quarterly. The stipend is \$779.36/per quarter.
  - b. The stipend will be reviewed yearly for possible adjustments by the 571 Budget Committee.
- 2. Reimbursement Guidelines
  - a. Reimbursement for mileage/parking will be provided for attendance at political events, from school/work to the event only. A requisition form with receipts attached must be included for reimbursement.
  - b. Reimbursements for all other materials needed to perform the duties should have receipts attached to a requisition form in order to be reimbursed.
  - c. Reimbursements for mileage, hotel accommodation, and meal per diem will be provided for overnight events (i.e., Springfield).
- 3. Political calls should be made from the Westmont Local office or your personal cell or home phone. Do not use school phones to make political calls.

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
