This scholarship honors past Franklin Park Teachers Council President Julienne Phillips. In addition to her career of service as an educator, Julie dedicated her time to the labor movement as President of the Franklin Park Council of Teachers from 2000 to 2011. Always known for her endless energy and positive attitude, she successfully led the teachers she represented. In addition to her role as Council President, Julie was an advocate of the West Suburban Teachers Union Local 571, the Illinois Federation of Teachers (IFT), and the American Federation of Teachers (AFT). Even after she retired, she stayed connected to the Union, and her passion remained for labor and Union advocacy. Julie enjoyed being an active member of the Local 571 Scholarship Committee. It always gave her great pleasure to support young adults in their quest to meet their college aspirations. In 2014 she began the conversation about creating a scholarship that could support teachers and other professional education staff who are looking to advance their educational experience.

Two (2), \$1,550 one-time scholarships will be awarded in 2022 by the West Suburban Teachers Union Local 571 to current licensed, practicing educators (teacher, social worker, counselor, psychologist, speech pathologist, librarian, nurse, or instructional coach) who are members in good standing of the West Suburban Teachers Union, Local 571, and pursuing a master's degree in an education-related field. Classes must be taken during the Summer 2022, Fall 2022 and/or Spring 2023 term(s).
